- (3) Include a copy of your FAFSA application; then
- (4) Submit six copies, each set stapled, to Bartlesville Community Foundation (please no bound copies, plastic sleeves, folders, etc.)

Where applicable, "service to school" is defined as involvement in school activities, such as clubs, service organizations, school government, pep squad, etc.

Deadline for submission is March 13, 2009. A separate application form must be submitted for each scholarship for which you are applying.

Green Country Cattlemen's Assoc.	TBD	Both student and parent/guardian must be a member of the Green Country Cattlemen's Association. The applicant must be a graduating senior who has been active in the beef industry or have a beef project.	One page essay capturing how the applicant would promote, support, and participate in the beef industry in the future. Personal interview and/or presentation may also be required.
Green Country Classic Ranch Rodeo	Up to \$1,000	The applicant must be a graduating senior who will/has competed, or whose parent will/has competed, in the 2009 Green Country Classic Ranch Rodeo. Applicants will be judged on scholastic achievement, quality of essay, a 2.5 or higher grade point average based on a four-point scale.	One page essay capturing how the ranching industry has influenced my life and/or my career plans
Mary Lou Price Girls Scholarship	TBD	Preference will be given to female students graduating from Bartlesville High School who might not otherwise have the opportunity to receive quality college education because of gender, family, or economic restrictions. Applicants will be judged on character, academic record, progress of the applicant, which may indicate potential benefit from higher education, and financial need of the applicant.	500+ word essay outlining the barriers to receiving quality college education that affect the applicant.

The applicant must have achieved a 3.0 grade average based on the four-point scale.	
Blair Thompson Russell Memorial Scholarship	\$1,000	Applicant must be a Bartlesville High School graduating senior. The applicant must have achieved a 2.5 grade average based on the four-point scale. Selection will be based on two important areas: demonstrated strong moral character and citizenship during high school years, and demonstrated ability to overcome personal obstacles in his/her life while demonstrating academic dedication.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. 500+ word essay explaining obstacles that have been overcome and areas of personal growth as a result of those challenges.</li><li>2. Two letters of recommendation, one from a BHS faculty member, one from a community member.</li></ol>
